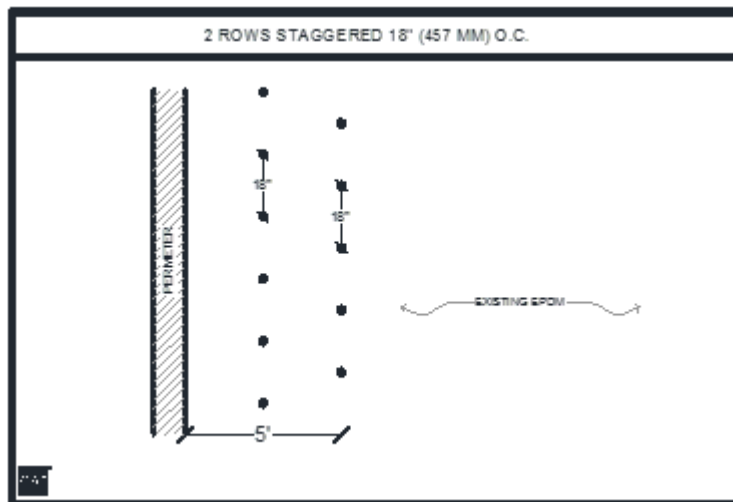
What is Changing?

GAF now allows... re-cover applications over fully adhered EPDM with EverGuard® TPO fleece-back membrane in low-rise foam (LRF)!

What Are GAF's Guidelines & Requirements?

- 1. Adhesion Test Required**
 - Insulation facer must remain bonded to the existing EPDM membrane.
- 2. Building Limitations**
 - <100 squares (929 m²) or
 - <15' (4.57 m) high without a parapet or
 - <40' (7.62 m) high with a parapet
- 3. Adhere-It® II Primer or CleanAct Rinsable Primer only.**
 - The existing EPDM membrane must be power-washed and then thoroughly cleaned with Adhere-It® II Primer or CleanAct Rinsable Primer prior to the installation of the EverGuard® TPO membrane.
- 4. Requires Supplemental Perimeter Fastening through the EPDM Membrane** prior to the installation of the EverGuard® TPO fleece-back roofing system.
 - Full Coverage/Spatter Pattern Application with GAF 2-Part Roofing Adhesive Only.**

What is the Supplemental Fastening Pattern Required at the Perimeter of the Existing EPDM Membrane?



Note: Supplemental perimeter fastening is required in **both** directions in **all** corners.
